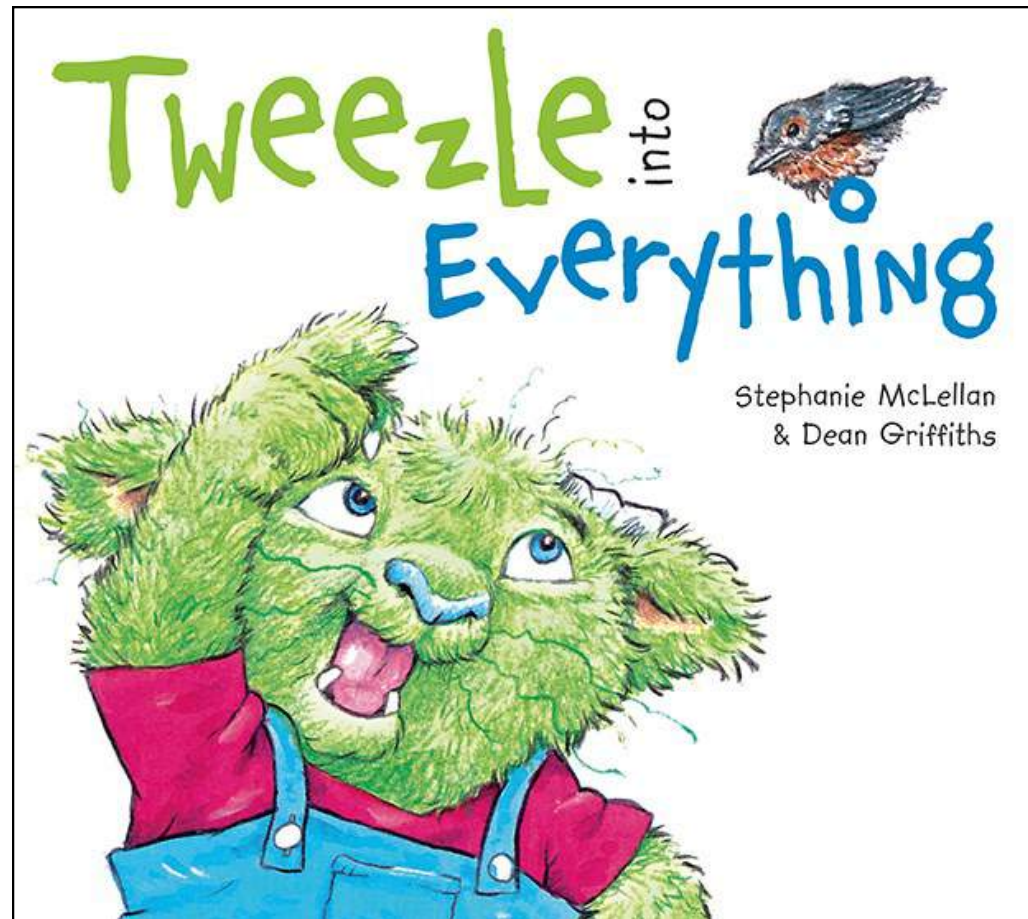

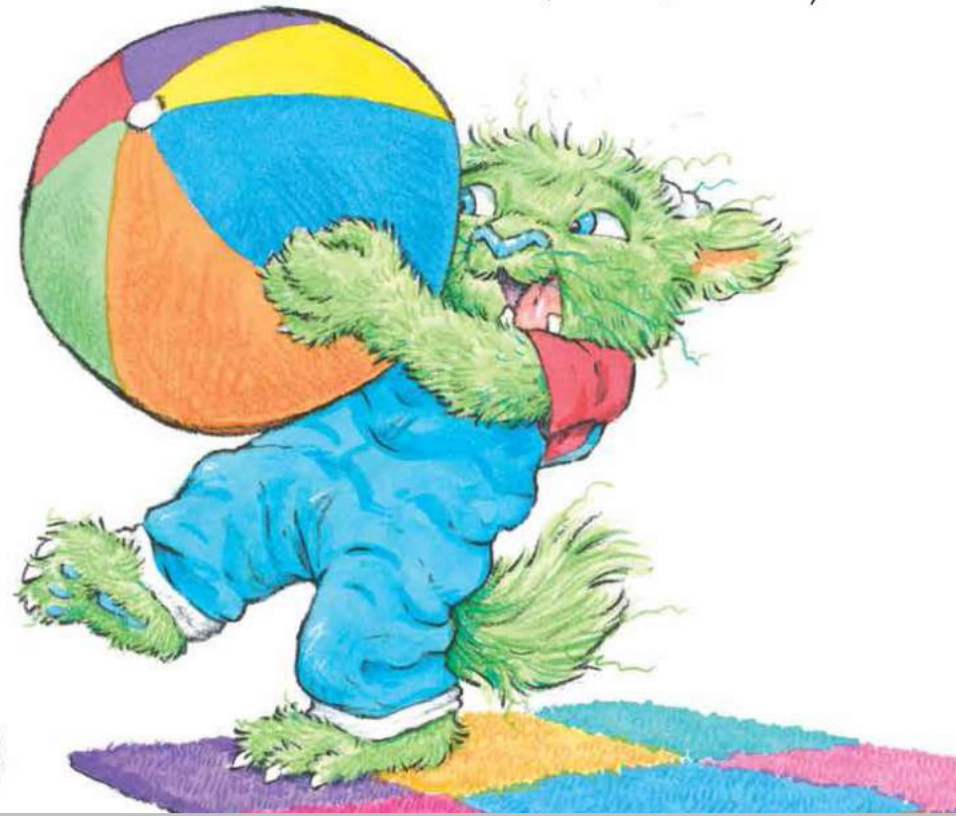

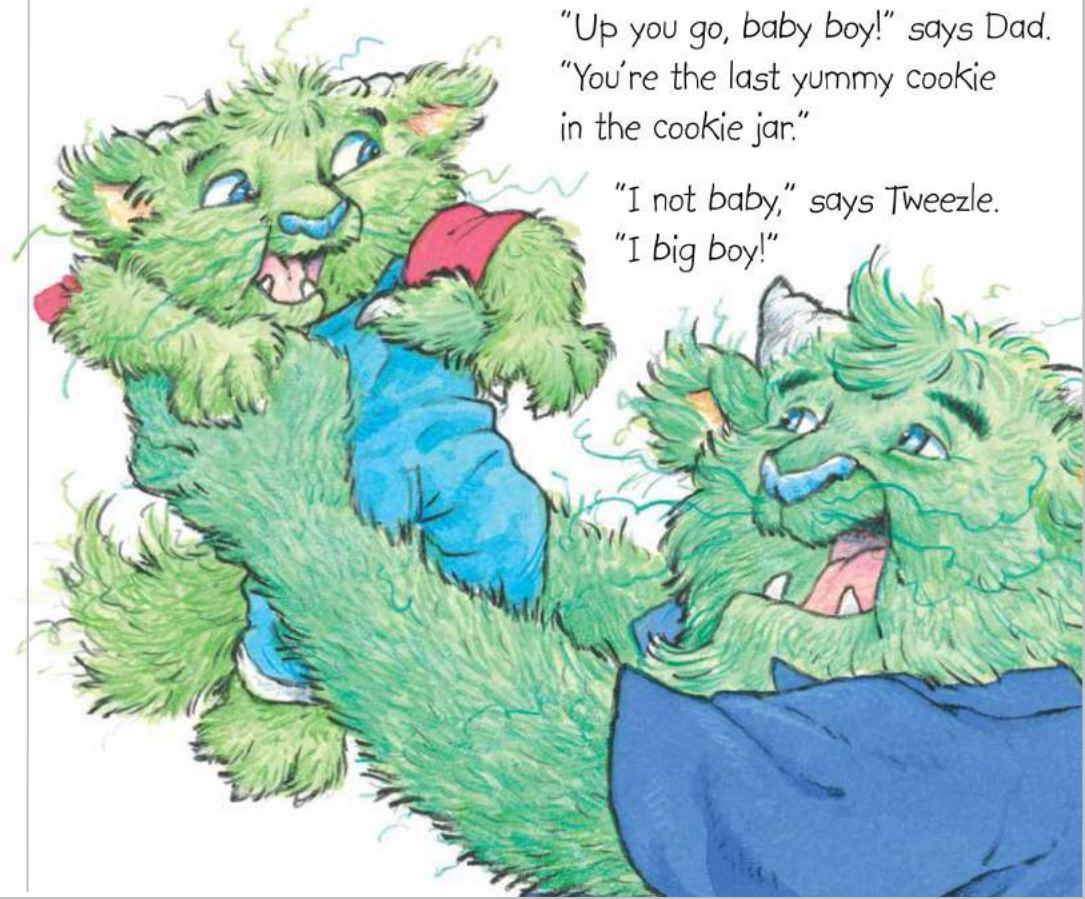
Pumpkin was the first.

"I big!" says Tweezle, grinning.



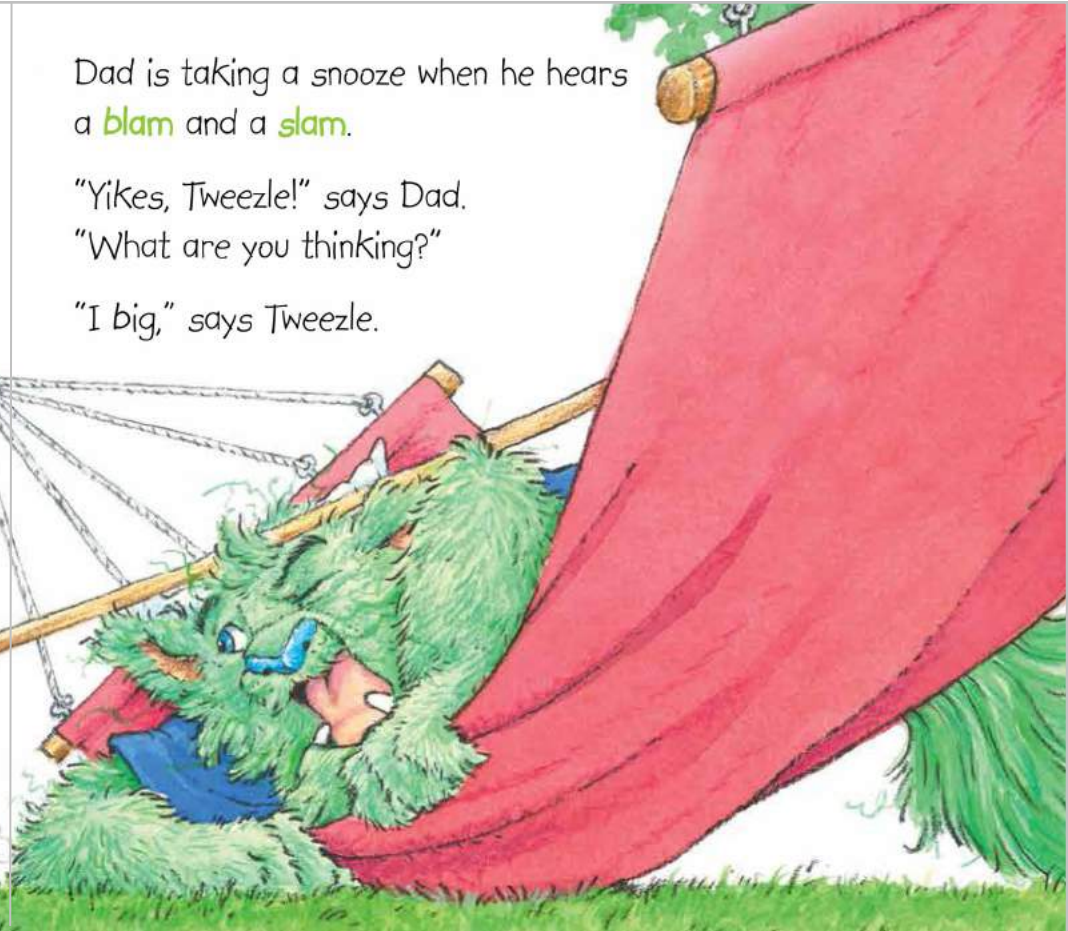


Dad is taking a snooze when he hears a **blam** and a **slam**.
